## **AGENDA ITEMS:**

## 1. Opening comments

Mr. Lancho Rodríguez thanked everyone for participating, and opened the meeting congratulating the team at TheEye for joining the Software Transparency Foundation. #### 2. Sponsorship program

Mr. Gomez presented Mr. Ailbirt and Ms. Rosso from TheEye. TheEye is an Open Source automation and workflow management system which they are looking at integrating with the OSSKB API. Mr. Gomez added that ongoing dialog is taking place with a number of universities and applications will start to formalize soon.

### 3. Project Office Updates

Mr. Coccia presented updates from the project office. We now have an automated report with OSSKB usage by date and country. This report will soon be circulated automatically.

Mr. Zheng has made great progress with the QoS solution for the API, which will be soon deployed in a test environment. This will provide a better solution to ensure the OSSKB API is available to all users.

Work is ongoing for bringing up the first OSSKB mirror in Hong Kong, which will improve service quality for APAC users.

#### 4. Marketing and events

A proposal has been submitted from the University of Waterloo to feature the OSSKB project for the MSR (Mining Software Repositories). It was discussed during the meeting that a weekly article will be generated and shared in the Foundation website and Linkedin channel.
